Dear FL Residential Living residents,

Great news! We have been informed by Ed Hudon from the Medicine Shoppe, that he has received confirmation of shipment of his order of the COVID-19 vaccine. Due to Ed's commitment to Frederick Living and our residents, he has pledged to vaccinate you before he offers the vaccine to the general public. We are grateful for his tireless work to secure the vaccine and his commitment to you.

With this exciting development, we have worked with Ed on a plan to offer the vaccine on our campus for each of you. Ed and a team of his staff will be on campus this Friday (January 29) to provide the first dose of vaccine to those of you that are interested. We apologize for the short notice. However, we needed to assure that he was going to receive his shipment, work around his schedule and availability, and get people vaccinated as quickly as possible.

The following outlines some details for Friday:

- Oaktree residents
  - Vaccination will start at 9 am on the first floor. It will take approximately an hour to complete each floor.
  - Residents will get vaccinated at their door. Once vaccinated, individuals should remain in their doorway or just outside in the hall for a period of 15-20 minutes for observation. A person will be available to deal with any reactions that a person might have to the vaccine.
  - Residents will need to sign a consent form. Frederick Living is providing the pharmacy with other pertinent demographic information (address, birthdate, Medicare #) and a copy of your insurance cards that we have on file. Residents should have insurance cards available in the event we don't have them.
- All other RL residents
  - Vaccination will start at 12:30 pm and will take place in the wellness suite.
  - Residents will be given a timeframe that they should arrive for their vaccination. This will help prevent long lines and allow for social distancing.
  - Residents should use the entrance beside the Body Shop and proceed directly to the Auditorium for registration.
  - Vaccination will take place in the Wellness Suite and individuals will return to the Auditorium for their observation time.
  - Bring insurance cards in case we need to make a copy to provide to the pharmacy.

Additional information

- Residents will need to wear masks at all times
- If you have tested positive for COVID-19 after January 14, you will not be able to receive the vaccine at this time.

*Live well with us*

- If you are in quarantine due to a close contact or recent move, please contact Emily. We will work with you to find a time and place for you to receive the vaccine.
- The vaccine being given is Moderna. This will require a second dose roughly 28 days from the initial dose. The specific date for this vaccine will be announced at a later time.
- We do not know at this time if there will be additional opportunities to receive the vaccine on campus (other than the second dose). Everyone that is interested in receiving the vaccine should do their best to be available on Friday.

We know that there will be questions that you have. We will continue to provide information as it is available. In the meantime, please contact Emily Messner with any questions or your concerns that you have.
